


What Is Candida?

Candida, sometimes called "yeast," is a type of fungus that can live in the mouth. If left untreated, Candida overgrowth can spread:

- **To the digestive tract**, making it hard to absorb proper nutrition.
- **To vital organs**, like the lungs, liver, or heart, especially in those with weakened immune systems.

- Those with diabetes or autoimmune diseases
- Those with circumstances that limit oral hygiene
- People who wear dentures
- Patients taking steroids or long-term antibiotics
- Toddlers and children

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Why Test for Candida?


Identify Hidden Infections

Detect Candida species that may not show symptoms but impact your health. Candida infections may often be a warning sign of potential underlying chronic or systemic disease.



Warning Signs of Candida Overgrowth


Do you experience any of the following?

- Unexplained bad breath
- Positive gastrointestinal Candida test results
- Creamy white spots inside the mouth (tongue or cheeks)
- "Burning mouth syndrome"
- A metallic, acidic, or salty taste
- Pain or difficulty eating
- Persistent gum disease despite low bacteria levels

Often, there are no symptoms! That's why early testing is essential.
